Other FIOA related improvements by OCTO:

- Began publishing redacted versions of FOIA Requests from FOIA express as open data.
- Began regular tracking of email search backlogs and have increased staffing and reduced backlogs. Email searches are a major factor in the timely processing of requests.
- Changed agency request form for searches so OCTO is no longer requiring agencies to submit more information to OCTO than is legally required for searches.
- OCTO used to try to charge agencies that needed new FOIAXpress accounts. That pushed agencies out of the system. OCTO negotiated a better deal with the vendor and no longer charge agencies.




